

New York State has one of the lowest rates of community transmissions of COVID-19 in the country, thanks to the many in our communities who are following social distancing, wearing masks properly and getting tested when they need it. Because of your focus in helping to limit the spread, we've achieved a decrease in coronavirus cases this month, and hospitalizations are down to less than 800 for the first time since March. But there is still work to be done to avoid spikes similar to the rest of the country. 40 U.S. states have recorded increases in cases this month, and new cases have jumped 20% per week in July nationwide.

HYBRID LEARNING MODEL

Based on guidance from the New York State Department of Health, the Monroe County Department of Health and the New York State Education Department, a hybrid learning model appears to best address the health and safety of our students and staff.

On defined days, some students learn remotely and others learn at school.

This limits the number of students in classrooms, on buses and in the hallways at one time. This plan is subject to change and dependent on the Governor's approval.

Students Will Be in 4 Groups

- GROUP 1 attends school on Monday and Thursday; remote learning takes place on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday.
- GROUP 2 attends school on Tuesday and Friday; remote learning takes place on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday.
- GROUP 3 includes English Language Learners and some special education students. They will attend school on Monday and Tuesday and Thursday and Friday; remote learning takes place on Wednesday.
- Student placement in Groups 1, 2 and 3 will be announced on July 31. At that time, we will also share the process for requesting a change to your child's assigned in-person learning days.
- . GROUP 4 are students who are choosing to learn remotely 100% of the time.
- All students will learn from home on Wednesdays so schools can be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected; and teachers and staff can participate in professional development and plan.
- · All teachers and support staff members will be working from school every day.

Why didn't the district pick a model where students attend school on two consecutive days?

We considered a model where students attend school on either Monday and Tuesday or Thursday and Friday but decided against it because doing so would have meant some students were away from the classroom for five consecutive days. Our selected model allows students in both Group 1 and Group 2 to be out of the classroom for a maximum of three days, which we feel is better for student learning.

If you choose the remote learning option, can students return to in-person instruction at some point?

Yes. By enrolling, you are agreeing that your children will remain in the 100% remote learning model for the first semester, at which point you will be able to choose whether you wish to continue.

Why can't parents choose to have their children attend school all five days of the week?

An in-person everyday option was considered but ruled out because it is not feasible given social distancing requirements in classrooms and on school buses. We could not have accommodated those requests and remained within the reopening perimeters outlined by New York State.

Will parents be able to change the days students attend school?

Yes. We recognize that any student grouping will be imperfect and some families will need to change their days. Our goal is to keep families together and accommodate childcare needs.

On the day the student groupings are announced, the district will also share a change request form for parents to complete. All requests will be considered on a space available basis. Requestors will not be able to a la cart in-person instruction days — meaning you cannot ask to go to school on Monday and Tuesday. You can only request to move from Group 1 to Group 2 or vice versa.



Which special education students will be assigned to Group 3 and return to school four days a week?

Special education students enrolled in self-contained (separate) classrooms will be assigned to Group 3 and all families of identified students will be notified by July 31. All remaining special education students (those enrolled in general education classrooms) will be placed in either Group 1 or Group 2. Regardless of your child's group placement, special education supports and services will be delivered to all students with an IEP. All students with Section 504 Plans will be placed in Groups 1 and 2.



What happens if a staff member or student is suspected of having COVID-19?

School nurses will have systems in place to screen students and staff who exhibit COVID-19 symptoms. Those individuals will be kept in a room separate from the nurse's office that is designated for isolation. If their symptoms require further evaluation they will need to leave the building. If the school district is notified that a staff member or student

has tested positive for COVID-19, the District Medical Director will work with the Monroe County Health Department to ensure all protocols relative to contact tracing and notification are followed.



When will the district announce who is in what group?

An announcement will be made no later than July 31.

Does a hybrid learning plan reduce educational expenses or lower taxpayer costs?

No. The district will continue to provide instruction to all students five days a week, although some students will be learning remotely every day. Our facilities and staffing needs have not changed. In some instances, the COVID-19 pandemic has created added expenses. Schools are now required to transport fewer students on each bus, provide new safeguards, purchase technology and offer professional development on safety protocols and online learning platforms.



Will schools only be cleaned on Wednesdays?

No. Schools will be cleaned every day and high-use surfaces like desks, door handles and bus seats will be cleaned multiple times per day. Deep cleanings performed on Wednesdays and over the weekend will be more extensive and include areas that students and staff don't routinely touch.

INFORMATION SHEET: K-12 LEARNING MODEL FAQS

For the 2020-21 school year, the Greece Central School District is developing plans for in-person instruction, a hybrid model of instruction and fully remote instruction. This information sheet represents what we know to be true at this time. Exact schedule and learning expectations are being finalized and will be shared with families in August. As always, plans are subject to change and dependent on the Governor's approval.

What will remote learning look like?

Remote learning will be different than what families experienced this spring. Students will be expected to log on and engage in instruction every day. Daily attendance will be taken. Each day/class will start with a morning meeting where teachers take attendance and establish the expectations for the day. Direct instruction will be provided using a combination of whole group, small group and oneto-one instruction. Other learning will be more student-directed and require students to watch pre-recorded lessons or complete written assignments.

Parents will be partners in remote learning and we will provide the appropriate curricular resources. In all circumstances, school staff will be in regular contact with students and families and we will be checking to make sure school work is completed.

For those families who choose the 100% virtual option, registration is for the entire first semester, at which point you can determine whether you wish to continue.

What will the hybrid model look

For both elementary and secondary students, teachers will provide families with a weekly schedule so they know what is expected. Schedules and coursework will vary by teacher and school, but here is an idea of what to expect.

Elementary

At the elementary level, students will have an established daily schedule for inschool and remote learning. Teacher-lead instruction will focus on a combination of class meetings, social/emotional development and direct instruction. Each day will start with a morning meeting where the teacher takes attendance and establishes the expectations for the day. In addition to receiving instruction in English Language Arts, math, social studies, and science, students will continue to participate in art, music, physical education and library.

We recognize that elementary students may need help accessing remote learning so we will be as flexible as possible. Teacher-lead learning opportunities for elementary students will be recorded for families to access at a later time if their schedule prevents students from participating in real time. These lessons will be supplemented by independent practice of skills at home.

Secondary

Students in middle and high school will follow their typical class schedule whether they are learning remotely or in school. Schools will use block scheduling to maximize instructional time, ensure consistency and build in natural breaks for study hall or lunch.

Each class will start with a teacher taking attendance and establishing the expectations for the day. Instruction may be provided using a combination of whole-class, small group and one-to-one instruction, as well as pre-recorded videos and independent work.

How will students be graded?

Unlike this spring, traditional grades will be assigned so its important students stay on track whether they are learning in school or from home. Students will be expected to complete written assignments as well as classwork and home-

work. Teachers will be connecting with students and families regularly about their progress. Quizzes and tests will also be given as needed and report cards will be provided.

Work submitted for grading will take many forms and can include writing pieces, responses to online assessments, the submission of a video recording, audio recording or photo of student work, a one-on-one conversation between student and teacher, or any other means deemed acceptable by the teacher.

To maintain academic integrity in the remote setting, unless specifically directed to do so by their teacher, students are expected to work independently on all assignments and submit their own work.

What technology platforms will students be using?

The following technology platforms have been selected as the primary tools for teachers to use when delivering remote learning plans to students:

KINDERGARTEN - 2ND GRADE

Seesaw for Schools

GRADES 3 - 12

Google Classroom

Students at all grade levels will use Google Meet to connect with their teachers and classmates in real time. Teachers will review each platform with students at the start of the school year, and will integrate Seesaw/Classroom/Meet as a regular part of their instruction throughout the year. Overviews and informational videos on each platform will also be shared with parents.







COVID-19: Quarantine vs. Isolation

QUARANTINE keeps someone who was in close contact with someone who has COVID-19 away from others.





If you had close contact with a person who has COVID-19



Stay home until 14 days after your last contact.



 Check your temperature twice a day and watch for symptoms of COVID-19.



If possible, stay away from people who are at higher-risk for getting very sick from COVID-19.

ISOLATION keeps someone who is sick or tested positive for COVID-19 without symptoms away from others, even in their own home.





If you are sick and think or know you have COVID-19



- Stay home until after
- At least 10 days since symptoms first appeared and
- At least 24 hours with no fever without fever-reducing medication and
- Symptoms have improved



If you tested positive for COVID-19 but do not have symptoms



- Stay home until after
- 10 days have passed since your positive test



If you live with others, stay in a specific "sick room" or area and away from other people or animals, including pets. Use a separate bathroom, if available.
