In February of their junior year, students who are eligible candidates for NHS will be invited to attend a meeting where they will receive a Candidacy Packet to complete. Eligible candidates are invited based on a minimum cumulative GPA of 88%. In addition, the packet will require students to submit evidence of their leadership, service, and character.

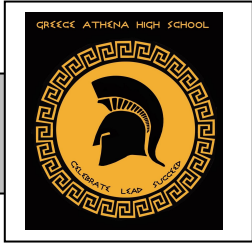
If students wish to be considered eligible, they will have already had to show proof of community service that is to be completed during the first half of their junior year. Students can begin acquiring these hours as early as July 1 following their sophomore year. Inducted members must complete additional community service and tutoring activities during their senior year.

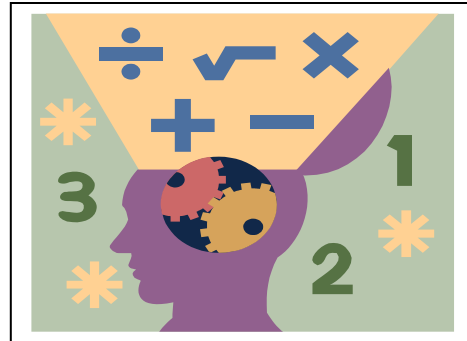


MATH / MEDIA

YEARBOOK

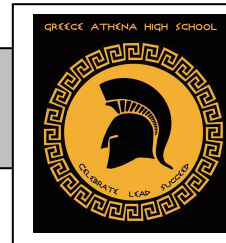
